Giant Step Forward for the MG Ben Butler Scholarship Program:

As Chairman of the Association of the Century I was honored to sign the recent agreement between the Association of the Century and The Community Foundation of Louisville that formally establishes the MG Benjamin J. Butler "Century Division" Scholarship Fund effective January 1, 2008. The advantages to the AOC in doing this are numerous but most importantly it provides professional management and reporting of both our assets invested in the scholarship fund as well as providing unbiased management of the selection process used to identify scholarship recipients.

The AOC has established the "Century Division" Fund with an initial investment of \$53,000 from our existing investments. The process of

qualifying applicants each year will remain with the AOC Scholarship Committee. Once the list of qualified applicants has been identified, the list of names along with individual application packets will be forwarded to a three person Selection Committee appointed entirely by the Community Foundation of Louisville to select the winning applicant/applicants. There will be one AOC member that will sit on the three person Selection Committee. In 2008, we will award a single \$1,000 scholarship grant. In future years, with additional donations from various sources our plan is to increase the number of scholarships awarded.

The "Century Division" Scholarship Fund is also unique in that an applicant for a grant must be an active, retired or former member of the 100th Infantry Division or the 100th Division (Institutional Training) or be a direct lineal descendant of one of those members. Currently, for example, the 100th Infantry Division Association sponsors three separate scholarship programs, one at the Virginia Military Institute (VMI), and one at Fort Jackson and the third at Fort Bragg. While very successful, none of these programs provide grants specifically for 100th Division members or their offspring. It is our hope for the future that the 100th Infantry Division Association and its members will see value in supporting a fund designed to specifically benefit members of the 100th Division or their direct descendants.

Lastly, a significant benefit of using the Community Foundation of Louisville is that you can make a gift of cash, stocks, bond, real estate or other assets to the Foundation. Your gift will qualify for maximum charitable benefit under state and federal law. (See donor form elsewhere in this issue) Why not take advantage of this tax deduction for the 2007 tax year by sending in a donation prior by Dec 31, 2007.

In closing, I wish each of you a Very Merry Holiday Season and Hope for a Healthy and Prosperous New Year in 2008. Thanks to each of you for your service to our great nation and to the 100th Division.

MINUTES OF ANNUAL BUSINESS MEETING SATURDAY 18 August 2007

1. Call to Order: MSG Richard C. Talbott called the meeting to order at 1300 at Crowne Plaza Hotel, Lexington, Kentucky 18 August 2007 with COL Joseph Theobald leading the Pledge of Allegiance to the United States of America.

2. Minutes of the 17 August 2006: Motion was made to approve minutes as published by CSM Ray Lackey and seconded by MG John Tindall. Motion carried.
3. Treasurer's Report: COL Jennings was unable to attend the meeting due to his wife June being in a serious head-on collision 15 May 2007. June is now home and will be going through many months of rehabilitation. COL Rick Rowe reported, Financial Statements for First and Second Quarters March 31 and June 30, 2007 were provided all board members in attendance at the 5 August 2007 Regular AOC Board Meeting. The annual budget for 2007 has been prepared. Finance Committee met immediately following the February Board Meeting to prepare budget. Members present were COL Jennings, Chairman, COL McBride and SGM Zimmerman. COL Tichenor also attended with input on Newsletter expenses. Therefore, Treasurer's Reports stand as of 5 August 2007.
4. Membership Report: MSG Talbott reported there were eleven (11) new members since last report. Copies of Membership Report were provided all Board Members present. However, she was sure her Grandfather; COL Cleland White would accept it for her. At the lunch prior to the Annual Business Meeting, COL Cleland White accepted the Scholarship Award for his granddaughter.
7. 8. Historical Holding Center (Museum): COL Joe Theobald reported that COL Harris the Museum Curator was on a trip west with his wife and friends and will not able to attend the Annual Business Meeting and the Formal Dinner the first meeting missed in years. COL Harris

asked that COL Theobald report that the Historical Holding Center will be moved to Fort Knox FY 2011 and he has requested 6000 feet for the holding center and museum. COL Harris will continue to be the Museum Curator.

9. Webmaster Report: COL Theobald reported for COL Jennings who is the AOC Webmaster could not attend due to his wife recovering from an auto accident. COL Theobald reported that 10 individuals submitted their Annual Meeting Reservations using the web sit. Web Site is up and functioning. As COL Theobald will be the AOC President in the upcoming year, he encourages all AOC Members to use the AOC Website and if anyone has any suggestions to improve website please submit to him.

11. Nomination Committee Report: COL Charles McBride and COL Jim Starr presented the Nominating Committee Report (copy attached). We have two (2) vacant positions and maximum numbers of board

members are: 25. COL McBride submitted the report for approval. Motion was made to approve by MSG Brown and seconded by COL White. Motion carried. COL Bland nominated COL Norm Williams and MSG James Goodall to service on the AOC Executive Board with terms expiring 2010. Motion to approve was made by MSG Brown and seconded by COL White. Motion carried. COL McBride reported the Election of Directors will be made at the November 2007 AOC Board Meeting.

12. New Business:

- Foundations: General Barron reported at the February 2007 AOC Board Meeting the decision was made to form a committee to look at the feasibility of establishing a foundation for the Benjamin J. Butler Scholarship Fund. Committee Members appointed are: MG Bill Barron - Chairman; MG John Tindall - Vice Chairman; COL Rick Rowe - member - Investment Advisor; MAJ Carl Platt - member - Legal Counsel; CSM Charlie Kaltenthahler - Enlisted Representative and Marking Advisor. Additionally, COL Ken Kapp, a local CPA and former member of Division, volunteered his services to the Committee for Accounting Advice. On May 20th General Barron and General Tindall met with Mr. John Plamp, retired member of the 100th Infantry Division living in Louisville to discuss how foundations were utilized by the 100th Infantry Division to manage their various scholarship programs. The AOC Foundation Committee first met on May 30th in Louisville. The consensus of the committee was to contact the Community Foundation of Louisville for further information regarding their program. Ken Kapp agreed to initiate this action on behalf of the Committee. There is a scheduled meeting with the Director of Gift Planning for the Community Foundation of Louisville. On August 16th, MG Barron, MAJ Platt and COL Kapp met with Ms. Linda Speed, JD who is the Director of Gift Planning for the Community Foundation of Louisville. The three of us spent over an hour with Ms. Speed gaining information about their organizations.

Key points include:

- \$50,000 is the minimum amount to establish a scholarship endowment fund.
- Once contributed, the money cannot be returned to the donor.
- Four different funds are available: This can be changed quarterly.
- Balanced Fund Earnings for the past: Three Years is 7.8%; Fiver Years is 5.8%; Ten Years is 7.1%

- Then fund has a 5% Spending Policy (4% available for gift - 1% expense load)
- Normally a four person selection committee will select scholarship winner/winners. Three members of committee would come from Foundation Staff and one member would represent the AOC.

Advantages of using organization like The Community Foundation of Louisville:

- Professional, Experienced and Knowledgeable Fund Management.
- Eliminates bias in the selection of scholarship awardees.
- Louisville based organization readily accessible.
- Promotes contributions by other organizations such as the 100th Infantry Division.
- Provides perpetuity to the foundation ideas behind the Benjamin J. Butler Scholarship Award

Motion was made to accept the Foundation Search Committee's recommendation for the AOC to proceed with establishing Benjamin J. Butler Scholarship Foundation in an amount not limited to \$50,000 to continue to perpetuate the foundation ideas behind the MG Benjamin J. Butler's legacy and the scholarship in his name.

The Executive Committee unanimously approved the adoption of the Benjamin J. Butler "Century Division" Scholarship Fund through the Louisville Community Foundation and funded with a minimum of \$50,000 from existing AOC investments.

General Barron reported that the Foundation must be approved at the Annual Business Meeting so as to follow the AOC By-Laws.

Motion was made by the General Membership at the Business Meeting to approve the adoption of the Benjamin J. Butler "Century Division" Scholarship Fund through the Louisville Community Foundation and funded with a minimum of \$50,000 from existing AOC investments. Motion unanimously carried by the AOC Board and General Membership in attendance.

- Joint Convention with the 100th Infantry Division "2009" with the 100th AOC as the host for the Convention. SGM Bob Hicks is Committee Chairman and will be working with Mr. John Plamp from the 100th Infantry Division on arrangements and etc. The Convention will be the same time for our Annual Business Meeting for 2009.

- 2008 Annual Meeting: COL Theobald reported the location will be Bowling Green, KY at the Holiday Inn. MSG Brown has been working with the Holiday Inn, and, as of now we have the same pricing as we had for 2007.

"PICKLE PACKING" & "SOS"

"Pickle Packing" by AOC volunteers during 2007 has reached new records. Over 170 packages have been stuffed this year with everything from chewing gum to foot powder and then sent to 100th Division soldiers serving in Iraq and Afghanistan. Included with the food stuff and

personal hygiene items have been letters from the AOC president and a free membership in the AOC. All this is being done to let our soldiers know that the membership of the AOC appreciates their service and most importantly recognize the sacrifice that they and their families are enduring.

The current mailing consisted of 66 holiday greeting cards with both a calling and PX gift card enclosed for the soldiers use to call home and to purchase either a gift or a personal item that was needed during this season. Thus far in the last four years the AOC has sent over 600 packages to 100th Division soldiers serving in harms way. The feedback from the soldiers receiving these packages range from a simple "thank you" to "you made my day". Here are excerpts from just a couple of those letters:
